outside of our lovely classroom.



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YEAR 1

Year 1 have been busy this half term with their topic 'Where the wild things are'. We have done some superb writing - retelling the story of 'The Gruffalo' and have enjoyed looking for all sorts of living and non living things in our forest school sessions. The children have been exploring winter, too, and we are finding out about animals that live in cold environments. - Great work Year 1!







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YEAR 2

Over the past few weeks, Year 2 have become 'Wildlife Explorers' and travelled all across the globe! They've researched and studied a range of different species, placed them into correct classification groups and learnt amazing facts about penguins in the Arctic. Alongside being Zoologists, they've also become weather reporters by discovering the worlds climates and identifying and recording seasonal and daily weather patterns in the UK (mostly cold so far!).

Throughout their new and exciting careers, Year 2 had the time to create their own 'Gruffalo' character, re write the story and create a book! They used drama to help inspire their new characters as well as using their bodies in P.E to become the Owl, Fox and Mouse. Not only that, in October 2021 they entered a competition called 'The Poetry Bus' and submitted fantastic sense poems all about Autumn and...they were chosen to be published! We couldn't be any prouder.

In Maths, they have worked extremely hard to add and subtract two 2-digit numbers using a variety of methods, plus, they have recently transferred these skills when discovering money! Not only that, they have developed their problem-solving skills through the use of visual and practical resources.

To reward their resilience and determination, Year 2 had their own animal themed party and they dressed to impress! We had a range of animals including bumble bees, cats and giraffes! They made their own decorations and used their math skills to create an inventory. How organised!





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YEAR 3

We have had a really busy half term in Year 3, and the children have been a credit to the school and we couldn't be more proud of them.

We have had Liz from Peacemakers come and work with us. We have had 6 sessions and this has helped us to develop and improve our self-esteem. The children have all had a chance to fly on the magic carpet and their peers have all told them why they are special. They have spent time getting to know each other, discussed what makes a good friend, discussed feelings and how we can help each other during tough times. Such a positive experience and one we have learnt a lot from.

Year 3 spent a morning at Malvern Library, it was very exciting to walk up there and spend time learning outside the classroom. We met James and he taught us about how the library works, how we find out information and how we can access other activities the library runs. We spent time sorting books, ordering them and completing a Healthy Eating Quiz. Lots of children borrowed books and were excited to visit again.





We have also spent some time learning how to keep our bodies healthy and what to do when things go wrong. We had a first aid session with Grace from Mini First Aid and learnt how to do CPR, how to treat a burn and how to put someone in the recovery

position. We all got given homework to know where we live in case we need to ring 999. A very worthwhile afternoon and the children learnt lots.









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YEAR 4

Year 4 have had an excellent half term exploring how the human body works and what it needs to keep healthy. They've all researched and produced their own healthy lunchbox leaflets and applied their learning through our 'Great Parish Bake Off' in their design and technology lessons. The children were very enthusiastic about testing some new foods and flavours and had great ideas for their granola bars. We're all looking forward to the final and choosing our winning bar.

We were also very happy to be able to welcome some visitors into school this term. Grace from Mini First Aid gave us all some training in what to do in an emergency and how to do CPR, put people in the recovery position, treat cuts and burns and what to do if someone is choking. Everyone had a go at chest compressions on the mannequin and we were really impressed at how well they answered questions and remembered everything after.








The Peacemakers have been visiting Y4 every week this term. We have been 'Celebrating our differences and enjoying our similarities'.

First, we read a story about a family who had an autistic daughter and how her brother had both similarities and differences to her. The children really enjoyed the music session, particularly watching the effect music had on animals!



The children were visited by a person with a disability and learnt how not all disabilities were

obvious. They also thought about their own abilities.



Finally, we listened to Baroness Floella Benjamin's autobiography about her arrival in Britain, how she felt different and attitudes towards her. The class worked in groups to find out about different religions around the world.

Year 4 have thoroughly enjoyed the weekly visits and activities and finding out about how people are similar, vet different.






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


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YEAR 5



Then, we found out that the English Civil War



Later in the half term, we found out that towards the end of the Civil War, Charles I was executed for treason. We held our own minitrial to decide what should have happened to Charles and discuss whether or not his trial had been fair. Unfortunately for Charles, we agreed that his head should be chopped off!

We also completed a science investigation to find out which shape of ammunition would travel the furthest. We chose different shapes to test and used our knowledge of forces to explain what happened. We found that the shapes that created the least air resistance travelled the furthest.





To finish our topic, we found out about life in Britain after the death of Charles. We found out that Oliver Cromwell, the leader of the Parliamentarians, was in charge for a while but when that didn't go too well, the people of Britain invited back Charles II to be king instead.











On Friday 11th February, we were also lucky enough to get to visit The Commandery in Worcester. After a short coach trip to the city centre, we spent the day exploring the museum and seeing lots of Civil War artefacts. During our battle workshop, we got to see replicas of armour and weapons that the soldiers would have worn and we even got to have a go at doing our own pike drills. We then got to walk up to Fort Royal and see where the last battle of the Civil War happened. It was a great day and we all enjoyed finding out more about our topic.



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YEAR 6

Y6 have had a brilliant half-term. We've been working really hard preparing for our SATs but have also had lots of fun. We were learning all about the English Civil War and really enjoyed finding out about the highs and lows of life in the 1600s. We got messy in art as we created heads from modroc - something that was new to us. We had to work hard to form facial features from wire before covering our creations in modroc - all before it went hard! The heads are looking fantastic - it's like having an extra 30 people in our classroom! We also learned all about what type of a king Charles I was - we



suggested he could have done better! We had a fun afternoon where we put King Charles I on trial - we presented our evidence and then voted on whether he was guilty of treason or not. We decided he was guilty and therefore it was right that he was






beheaded. To round off our topic, we headed out of the classroom to Worcester. We spent a day visiting the Commandery which was the Royalist headquarters during the Battle of

Worcester. We found out all about getting ready for battle as we learned all about the different weapons and clothing that were worn during battle. We had



a tour of Fort Royal which was partly where the Battle of Worcester took place and we took part in the process leading up to firing a cannon. One of our favourite things though was the pike drill. We were all given a long,


